Blueberry Pie



This recipe was submitted by Patti Derr for our church cookbook. She tells us that this pie originated at Castle Berry Farm. It is absolutely delicious with a little bit of whipped cream or ice cream on top!!

If you don't have a NUMC Cookbook yet, there are still plenty available. They cost \$10 each and are available in the Church Office.

Ingredients:

9" pie shell (baked) 3 T. corn starch 1/4 cup water 3/4 cup sugar 1 T. butter 1/4 t. salt 4 c. blueberries 1 T. lemon juice

- 1. Mix dry ingredients in a sauce pan. Add water and just 2 cups of the blueberries. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly until it comes to a boil and is thickened. Mixture should be clear and thick.
- 2. Remove from heat and stir in butter and lemon juice. Cool.
- 3. Place second 2 cups of blueberries in baked pie crust and pour cooked and cooled berry mix over the top. Refrigerate.
- 4. Serve with whipped cream or ice cream!
