

Nimmonsburg UMW-Active Once Again!



After almost two years of inactivity the Nimmonsburg United Methodist Women started up with activities galore beginning in October. On Sunday, October 3rd, we prepared the church service that focused on the ideals and goals of the worldwide United Methodist Women, the largest women's religious organization in the world. (*By the way, all women of our church are considered members.*)

That was followed two weeks later by our Fall Rummage Sale. We hadn't had a rummage sale in nearly two years and people were anxious to participate, bring their stored up items and shop! We nearly met our goal of \$1,000 and while the sale was on the quiet side, the lack of crowded conditions made it safer.

The following week the Binghamton District United Methodist Women chose our church to hold their annual Candle-Burning Ceremony. There was a small gathering of women, a brief program and then candles were lit in memory of or in honor of people in our district's churches. Our sanctuary looked beautiful with the many lit candles.

In November we hosted Fellowship Time to raise money for Church World Service's Blanket Program. We received enough funds to provide 30 blankets to needy people facing cold winter conditions without a warm blanket. Other projects during this time were calendars and cards for the Greater Binghamton Health Center and shoe boxes for the Binghamton Boys and Girls Club. Rebecca Olivet and I delivered 63 boxes on December 20th in time for their Christmas Party the following Wednesday.

That's not all. A group of us got together to give away the Rummage Sale funds and other monies donated by individuals to charities. The following groups will receive at least \$100, and some will receive more: Action for Older Persons, the local chapter of the American Red Cross, Bandera Christmas Dinner, Broome County Council of Churches, CHOW, Catherine's Pantry, Danielle House, Henderson Settlement, Life Choices, Mercy House, Mom's House, Project Concern, Rise, and our local Salvation Army. We may have enough left to help several other worthy causes.



French Onion Soup

Ingredients:

3 large Onions, thinly sliced 4 cups hot water 1/2 t. salt Croutons 1/2 cup Margarine or Butter1 t. Worcestershire Sauce2 T. instant beef bouillon or6 bouillon cubes

Parmesan Cheese

- 1. In large skillet, cook onions in butter until lightly browned.
- 2. In pot, combine browned onions in butter with bouillon, water, Worcestershire Sauce and salt. Cover. Cook on low at least one hour.
- 3. When serving, top with croutons as desired, and sprinkle on Parmesan cheese.


