Nimmonsburg Church Cookbooks

Here is another one of the many wonderful recipes you will find in the Nimmonsburg Church Cookbook. This recipe was submitted by Nell Barnes. This is an old-fashioned super tasty quick bread (no yeast)! Perfect for toast with butter!

BUTTERSCOTCH BREAD

Ingredients

2 cups sifted flour 1 1/4 t. baking powder 3/4 t. baking soda

1/4 t. salt

1 egg slightly beaten

1 cup brown sugar

1 cup sour milk or buttermilk

1 T. melted shortening

1/2 cup chopped walnuts



- 1. Sift flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt.
- 2. Add chopped nuts and mix well.
- 3. Combine egg, brown sugar, milk and shortening.
- 4. Pour into flour mixture and stir just enough to moisten the dry ingredients. Do not beat.
- 5. Turn into greased loaf pan (9 1/2" x 5 1/2").
- 6. Bake at 350° for 45 to 50 minutes.
