APPLY NOW FOR ENDOWMENT FUNDS

The Guidelines for applying for Church Endowment Funds are as follows:

- 1. Requests can be received from Chairpersons or any member of our Christian family.
- 2. All requests should be in writing and submitted to Rex Decker, Chairman of Endowment, or Russ Sanaeko, Treasurer of Endowment by May 14, 2023.
- 3. Requests should include the date, person or committee requesting money, amount requested, date needed and a brief description as to use and justification of request.
- 4. The Endowment Fund Committee will subsequently submit their recommendations to the Administrative Board. The Board's decision will be put in writing and sent to the person or committee which made the requests.

Endowment funds are distributed in four categories:

- Special Needs 1.
- General Expense 2.
- **Building & Maintenance** 3.
- Missions 4.

Typically, each category received 1/4 of the funds available:

Special Needs—\$871.40 General Expense—\$871.40 Building & Maintenance—\$871.40 Missions-\$871.40

DISTRICT OFFICES RECONFIGURED

The Upper NY Extended Cabinet has shared its plan to reconfigure how administrative support is provided to its Districts. Beginning **July 1, 2023**, the current structure of eight part-time and two full-time Administrative Assistants will be replaced by six full-time Superintendency Administrative Assistants, each serving two districts as well as working collaboratively on the superintendency support team.

By January 1, 2024, it is anticipated that all Superintendency Administrative Assistants and District Superintendents will *work from home*, and all District Offices *will be closed*. In this arrangement, each District will still have a dedicated Administrative Assistant assigned to them.

Rev. Bob Kolvik-Campbell will be serving the Binghamton and Oneonta Districts.

APPLE PUDDING

This recipe was submitted by Shirley Savage for our Church Cookbook, and it sounds delicious. I am putting it on my "To Make" list for May!!


Ingredients:

8 apples, peeled, cored and sliced 6 T. sugar 1/2 cup sugar 4 T. butter 6 eggs, slightly beaten 1 t. vanilla 2 cups crushed graham crackers 1/4 t. nutmeg 1 pint sour cream


Directions:

- 1. Combine apples, 6 T. sugar and butter in saucepan and cook until soft.
- 2. In double boiler, mix eggs, sour cream and 1/2 cup sugar.
- 3. Cook to a custard consistency. Remove from heat and add nutmeg and vanilla.
- 4. Mix the custard mixture in with the apples.
- 5. Butter the sides and bottom of a 9 x 13 baking pan. Press the graham crackers in, and then pour in the mixture. Sprinkle with additional graham cracker crumbs.
- 6. Bake for approximately 1 hour at 350 degrees.
