Church Growth and the Cross Principle



Jesus placed discipline, suffering, and loss at the center of his path of leadership. Those who watched him were "*amazed*," and "*those who followed were afraid*" (Mark 10:32). As his disciples reorganized themselves after his resurrection, the community they grew continued to amaze people, and yet many were fearful and avoided committing themselves to the Way. Luke records this in the book of Acts, "*many signs and wonders were done among the people through the apostles…* [yet] None of the rest of them dared to join them, but the people held them in high *esteem*" (Acts 5:12-13).

It is common for us to hope that the church will grow. Interestingly enough, the writers of the Bible were not concerned about that. They knew that when we come together as a community of individuals struggling with Jesus' invitation, "*If any wish to come after me, let them deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me*" – when we embrace the cross principle as a way of life expressing love of God and neighbor, we can expect that power will come upon us (Luke 9:23). Love has healing power; grace is truly amazing. Lives are changed with God, abundance is found and lived.

The next time you feel yourself yearning for the church to be filled with power (and people), remember the cross principle and offer a prayer that Jesus may lead you into your next level of self-denial, divine discipline, and even loss (see inside for opportunities to sign up for the disciplines of study and/or service). As we focus more fully on the kin-dom of heaven, Jesus has promised that the doors of God's abundant love will open before us, *"seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well"* (Matthew 6:33).

Be sure to mark your donations as designated funds for the Sky Lake Campership Fund.


Releasing a Transforming Love (Parts I & II)

The following classes will be offered as a two-part series with Part II building on the work we share in Part I.


Part I-Life of the Beloved

Considered a new spiritual classic, this little book has already sold over 200,000 copies as it helps people understand more deeply what it means to be God's beloved children.


Part II—Justice in Everyday Life



The Holy Spirit has directed Pastors to equip the people of God to change the world as we allow God's yearning for righteousness and justice to resonate in our lives (Ephesians 4:12).

This class is designed to help participants develop the spiritual maturity to partner with the Holy Spirit in employing the power of love to right some of the wrongs we see around us.

Apply Now for Endowment Funds

It's time now to apply for Endowment Funds for 2024. The guidelines are as follows:

- Requests can be received from Chairpersons or any member of our Christian 1. family.
- All requests should be in writing and submitted to Rex Decker, 2. Chairman of Endowment, or Russ Sanaeko, Treasurer of Endowment by May 12, 2024.
- Requests shall include the date, person or committee requesting money, 3. amount requested, date needed, and a brief description as to how the funds would be used.
- The Endowment Fund Committee will submit their recommendations to the 4. Administrative Board. The Board's decisions will be put in writing and sent to the persons or committees which made the request(s).

Endowment Funds are distributed in four categories:

- **Special Needs** General Expense 1. 2. Missions
- Building & Maintenance 4. 3.

Typically, each category receives 1/4 of the funds available, plus any unspent funds from previous years. The total funds available in each category this year are:

- Special Needs-\$977.20 1.
- 2. General Expense-\$977.20
- Building & Maintenance—\$977.20 3.
- 4. Missions-\$1,848.60
