The choice God has made to call us "beloved" is not influenced by our performance, nor are we more beloved than anyone else. The measure of God's love for us is found in the life, healing work, death, and resurrection of Christ ... acts of love given to all.

This fall I have been deeply frustrated by the inadequacies of my performance in the role of Pastor. My health, compromised by rabies and then covid, has limited my ability to show up for many of the expected tasks of ministry. Your patience, though I imagine that you are often frustrated too, and kindness have reminded me that I don't have to pretend to be special. I am an ordinary person who struggles, and like each one of you, there are moments when God gives me wonderfully shiny love to share. In the words of the Apostle Paul,

> "We have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us." (2 Corinthians 4:7)

Though I hope soon to be restored to full health, it has been powerful to find God in the midst of ordinary journeys.

Letter to Nimmonsburg UMC

These are times of change in the United Methodist Church. Your attention, prayers, and presence as members and friends of the Nimmonsburg United Methodist Church (NUMC) are requested as we enter into an initial discernment of our relationship with the United Methodist denomination. At issue is an opportunity created by the Special General Conference of the UMC in 2019 that provides a process for individual churches to disaffiliate from the UMC for reasons of conscience while retaining their church building/s and financial resources.

The formal process of church wide discernment conversation, negotiation of financial obligations to the Annual Conference, and various levels of approval, will be costly in terms of time, energy, and money. Yet, it is possible that this path towards the Global Methodist Church (GUMC) is exactly where God is calling us to walk. Or, it could be that when we come together for conversation we discover that the Spirit is leading us to stay with the UMC. Either way, we need to know where we stand, and why. Pastor Jenni did a wonderful job of beginning these conversations. Our next step is to continue conversation, and take an informal anonymous poll that will help our Ad Board discern whether it is time to invest our time in a more formal process of discernment. Here is the way we will enter into an initial discernment.

First, on **November 6 at 4 pm**, Pastor Wheat will facilitate an informational session to help clarify the issues for the congregation. He will invite two colleagues that feel very strong about their decision, one to stay in the United Methodist Church and one to join the Global Methodist Church. He will ask them a series of questions that will provide the congregation context for each position. He will then ask those in attendance a series of thought-provoking questions to help us discuss as a body our thoughts and beliefs. We will then have an opportunity to join our hearts in worship, give our desires to God, and take time to listen together for the Spirit's leading. The congregation will be given a week to thoughtfully and prayerfully consider the information discussed.

Second, at the service on **Sunday**, **November 13**, an anonymous ballet will be distributed with the bulletins in order to take a straw poll of the membership. The ballot will have three options: stay with the United Methodist Church, move to the Global Methodist Church, or I don't have enough information to make a decision. We ask that each member of the church complete the poll, fold it, and place it in the offering plate. If you are unable to attend church that day, please feel free to drop off your vote in the church office until Wednesday, November 16th; Marge will tally the votes.

Third, the results will be discussed at the Ad Board meeting held on Thursday, November 17th. A majority of 2/3 or greater in favor of exploring disaffiliation or in need of more information, will guide our Ad Board towards initiating a more formal exploration process.

Our church stands at the juncture of a critical decision. As a membership, it is important that we all learn what the decision means and how it will impact the future of our church, prayerfully and thoughtfully consider our position, and communicate that position to the Ad board.
