Jesus draws us in to learn, sends us out to practice, and gives us time to reflect. As we walk the path laid out by the first disciples, this rhythm of learning, practicing, and reflecting can help us adopt the mission and own it together. The mission is beautiful, urgent, and important. It is the message of salvation, and it is in our hands. Please take time to think about how you can reach people; gently, respectfully, connect with people to listen to their spiritual journeys and if the door is opened to tell them about God's love.

Easy Pumpkin Pie Squares

You will want to serve these easy pumpkin pie squares this fall season. This is the perfect dessert for this time of year.

Crust:

1 1/2 cups graham cracker crumbs1/4 cup white granulated sugar1/2 cup (1 stick) melted butter

<u>Filling:</u>

3/4 cup white granulated sugar 2 tbsp. cornstarch 2 tsp. pumpkin pie spice* 1 can (15 oz.) pumpkin puree 1 can (12 oz.) evaporated milk 2 large eggs



Instructions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350° . Grease bottom and sides of 9 x 13 baking pan with butter.
- 2. Combine graham cracker crumbs, sugar and melted butter until evenly moistened. Empty into prepared baking pan, press down evenly with a spoon, and bake the crust for 20 minutes.
- 3. While crust is baking, add sugar, cornstarch and pumpkin pie spice to a large mixing bowl. Whisk until well combined.
- 4. Add pumpkin puree, evaporated milk and eggs. Whisk until the mixture is smooth.
- 5. After 20 minutes, remove crust from oven and pour in the pumpkin pie filling. Smooth out and bake for 30-35 minutes. You can tell the squares are ready when the edges are set and the center no longer jiggles if you gently shake the pan.
- 6. Let squares cool for at least 3 hours. Once cooled, remove from the pan and cut into 12, 16 or 20 squares. If desired, garnish with whipped cream and a sprinkle of pumpkin pie spice. Serve cold or at room temperature. Enjoy.

*If you don't have pumpkin pie spice, make your own by mixing the following: 1 1/2 t. ground cinnamon; 3/4 t. ground ginger; 1/2 t. ground nutmeg; and 1/8 t. ground cloves


Church Women United
